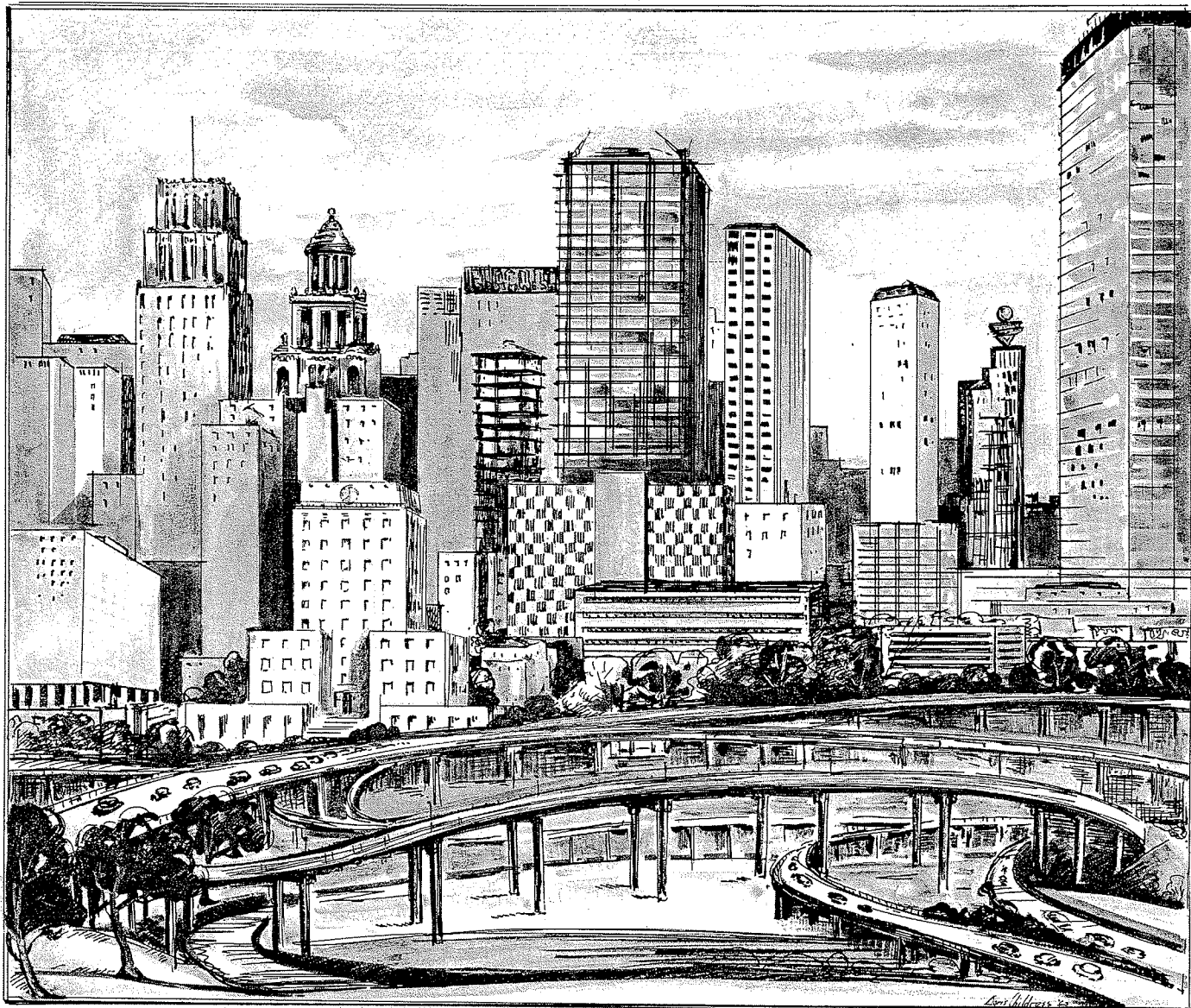


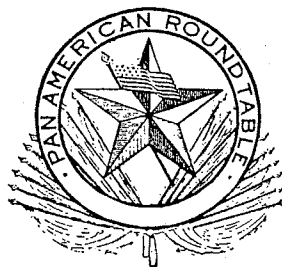

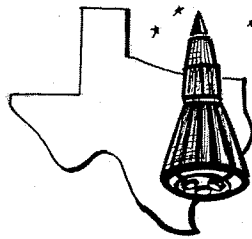

BAYOU BEND

Latin Colonial home designed by John Staub and Birdsall Briscoe for Miss Ima Hogg and her brother in 1924. Miss Hogg designed the gardens, 14 acres, consulting with various landscape architects. She purchased the statues for the Diana garden in Europe. In 1920 she began her collection of American antiques which is without peer in the southwest. It has been given to the Museum of Fine Arts in Houston and next year will be opened to the public.

Front Hall - 18th Century Pennsylvania Chippendale mahogany console table, original marble top. Chest on Chest, Thomas Affleck. Mahogany lowboy. Waschman Lisle Highboy, mahogany. Chippendale Chairs. Portrait of James Stephen Hogg, Governor of Texas.

Drawing Room - Chippendale style, New York, Philadelphia and Newport pieces. Mirror 1760, Sofa 1775. Portrait by Charles Wilson Peale.

Pine Room - Furniture of the William and Mary period 1650-1702. Whieldon flower holders c. 1775. Fine slipware wall plates - Wisterberg & Steigel glass.

Blue Room - Massachusetts Chippendale furniture 1750-1780. Settee and 8 matching chairs. Turret top tea table. Chest on Chest 1760. Kettle front mahogany secretary. Dr. Wall English transfer printed ware.

Murphy Room - Dutch influence black and white floor. Earliest 17th century furniture, American pewter, Disbrow chest, Court cupboard, early Delft.

Dining Room - Mirror 1780, walls painted by Wm. Mackay. Phyfe chairs and table. New England serpentine front sideboard. American Tucker porcelain pitchers, white salt glaze 1720-60. Wedgwood gold and green ceramics. Chinese Export porcelaine on mantle.

Second Floor - New port Room, collection of fine American silver. Every detail of room to scale of Nicholas-Wanton-Hunter house in Newport.

Texana Campaign China in Gothic cypress paneled room.

Queen Anne Sitting Room, 1702-1714. Daybed 1730-40. Fine bonnet type High Boy, japanned. Newport card table. Pastel by John Copley. Exquisite porcelaines.

Queen Anne Bed Room 1735-45. Maple four post bed 1760. Tea table, side chairs 1740. New England writing desk 1770. Pennsylvania chair.

Central Upstairs Hall - Philadelphia furniture 1750-80. Miss Hogg's portrait by Gerald Brockhurst. Portrait by John Singleton Copley. Walnut Queen Anne chairs.

Maple Room - Bonnet type high boy - New England piece c. 1740. Painted Pennsylvania grandfather clock, ladder back chairs. New England knee hole desk, 1765.

Guest Sitting Room - Tambour desk Sheraton style 1794-1800 Salem, Mass. New England Martha Washington chair, card table 1780. Zuber block printed wall paper Views of the Bosphorus, after original design by Jean Baptiste Le Prince., c 1750.

Guest Bed Room - McIntyre sofa, Salem bed 1790, carvings and bed hangings related in design. Sheraton arm chair. Pair Phyfe tables c. 1800. Adam style mirrors. Thomas Jefferson and John Quincy Adams, pastels by Sharpless, 1800.

Federal Room - on the second floor not included in these notes.
