## STATE DIRECTOR'S PROCEDURES

So many of these procedures go on at the same time; it would be wise to read all of them at once, dealing with them concurrently.

### I. Letters of appreciation to the newly elected officers.

### II. Treasurer

- a. A bond is required for this officer to be set by the state director as funds increase. Presently \$10,000. at \$ 25.00 per year.
- b. The Insurance Company of Ellis and Gonzalez, 1213 Matamoras Street Laredo, Texas has been carrying this bond since 1957 at one half of the regular fee, a considerable saving through the years. The immediate past State Treasurer must clear ALL checks of the last administration; therefore there may a delay until July for all funds to be cleared. The Bond begins also in July. Remember you must co-sign all checks; inform the treasurer to have a place on the checks for the State Director's signature - best to have blank not marked with your name, just the title.

### III. Appoint your State Chairmen

- a. Your State Constitution has details on each. However there is in this folder DETAIL information on each, especially the Scholarship. It would be wise to select the Publications chairman first as it is important to have this committee set for Texana. The letter of the Internal Revenue Service in the plastic part of this binder is the original and very important. DO NOT LET IT OUT OF YOUR HANDS. A photostat is necessary for the chairman of Texana to be used to get bulk mailing from the postmaster of her town - that is all that is needed to get bulkmailing regardless of what the postmaster says. It is important to involve all State Tables on some member on either a committee except those Tables having elected officers.

As long as it is possible it is wise to ask Mrs. Claude Nobles of San Antonio to serve as Archives chairman. She knows more about the history of P.A.R.T. than anyone in our Tables. She secured the agreement with St. Mary's to keep our archives INTACT. That agreement is also in the plastic part of the folder.

According to the State Constitution the Scholarship chairman becomes one on the committee just below the past chairman. This chairmanship goes by TABLES, not members. The list of Tables having this scholarship in under the information on this committee in the folder. Should the Table coming up refuses to accept go to the next in the committee. Should the chairman resign during your term of office, select someone from the same Table to carry on. The Revisions Chairman is your Parliamentarian.

State Director's procedures continued.

#### IV. Corresponding Secretary

The official stationery should be printed at once for your and her use. The cut is included with the State Seal in the box in the State Director's files. The form to use is shown on the copy of the stationery now in use, and included in the folder. *She has the State Table Charter forms,*

By May 15th this officer should send to all Board members ( this is Past State Directors, Elected and appointed officers ), Table Directors and others listed in the Corresponding Secretary's manual the names of the above except Past State Directors. Use the official stationery to print the Table Director's names and then she won't need to copy the elected officers. The appointed officers won't yet be completed, so also omit.

#### V. Board meeting in the even year.

Plan your Board so that in the fall Texana you can include the date and place. At the Board you will adopt the budget, previous budgets are in the folder. You appoint the budget committee at the Board's first meeting to report back the final meeting.

VI. With the present funds Texana can only be published twice in the first year Fall and Spring ( after the Board ); and three times in the second year, Fall, Spring, and May ( after the convention ). I would suggest the Months of October, February or March.

#### VII. General suggestions

Answer all correspondence as soon as it is possible. It is wise to keep very close contact with all Tables.

Keep a calendar of your official visitations by your telephone. Begin them I believe at once. I made the mistake of waiting until after Board, and find I was still visiting up to and after Convention.

Keep a record of your office ( postage and telegrams-telephone ), and your personal expenses. Don't rely on memory. It is customary to present an accounting at the Board meetings altho the budget allows for such expenditures.

Upon the death of a past State Director it is mandatory for your office to send a telegram to the family. ( The list is in the manual. ) If at all possible attend the funeral or designate someone of the officers near to attend in official capacity.

The pass book in Conroe is # 0-158. Our identifying number for IRS is 746 055 886.

There seems to me that the State loses a year of project work in that your appointive committee chairmen are usually uncertain of their projects until presented to the Board. This is because they are new at State work for we begin training our State officers at this level. I hope to have the Board at El Paso adopt the plan of having the chairmen of the immediate past Friendship, Education, and Interchange Library carry on their projects

under your direction or until you designate someone to carry on,

This will give continuity of the work in your first year. It will also free you to be selective in your choosing; not to rush you in your appointments; and let you form in your own mind what projects you wish to follow. It takes sometime to work up these projects, getting contacts, etc. I am also going to recommend that the New Director workshop be a permanent part of the Convention with the immediate past director in charge. (adapted)

The area workshops were of considerable good, and were well received. That is up to you to continue.

The treasurer and I hope to leave in the permanent Griswold fund in Conroe \$10,000 and have come to your treasurer each interest paying date a check, which is used for the scholarship itself. The scholarship money you have to spend, left over will be in a savings account in Austin. You are to use it for scholarship. The State operating funds will be sent directly to the new treasurer. Remember to keep the funds separated. Should memorials or gifts to the permanent fund come in it will be necessary to start a new insured savings account. Do not put it in Austin; the Austin account holds only interest and the 25% per capita scholarship dues. It has been approved that our scholarship be on a part basis, a travel grant from another agency, we pay the actual school expense, and the girl carry her own personal expense. This is not just the consensus of opinion of the former chairmen; it is also expert opinion of other agencies. Be sure that the travel grant carry accident and hospital insurance from the time she leaves her home until she returns. All State Department grants carry that, but be sure to check it yourself. Take nothing in this exchange for granted.

Good luck and remember you are working for the finest group of women in the state of Texas. They will cooperate wholeheartedly. You will also find that the past State Directors will work for you also, and of course I will do all I can to lighten your responsibilities. With every good wish for your success, I am

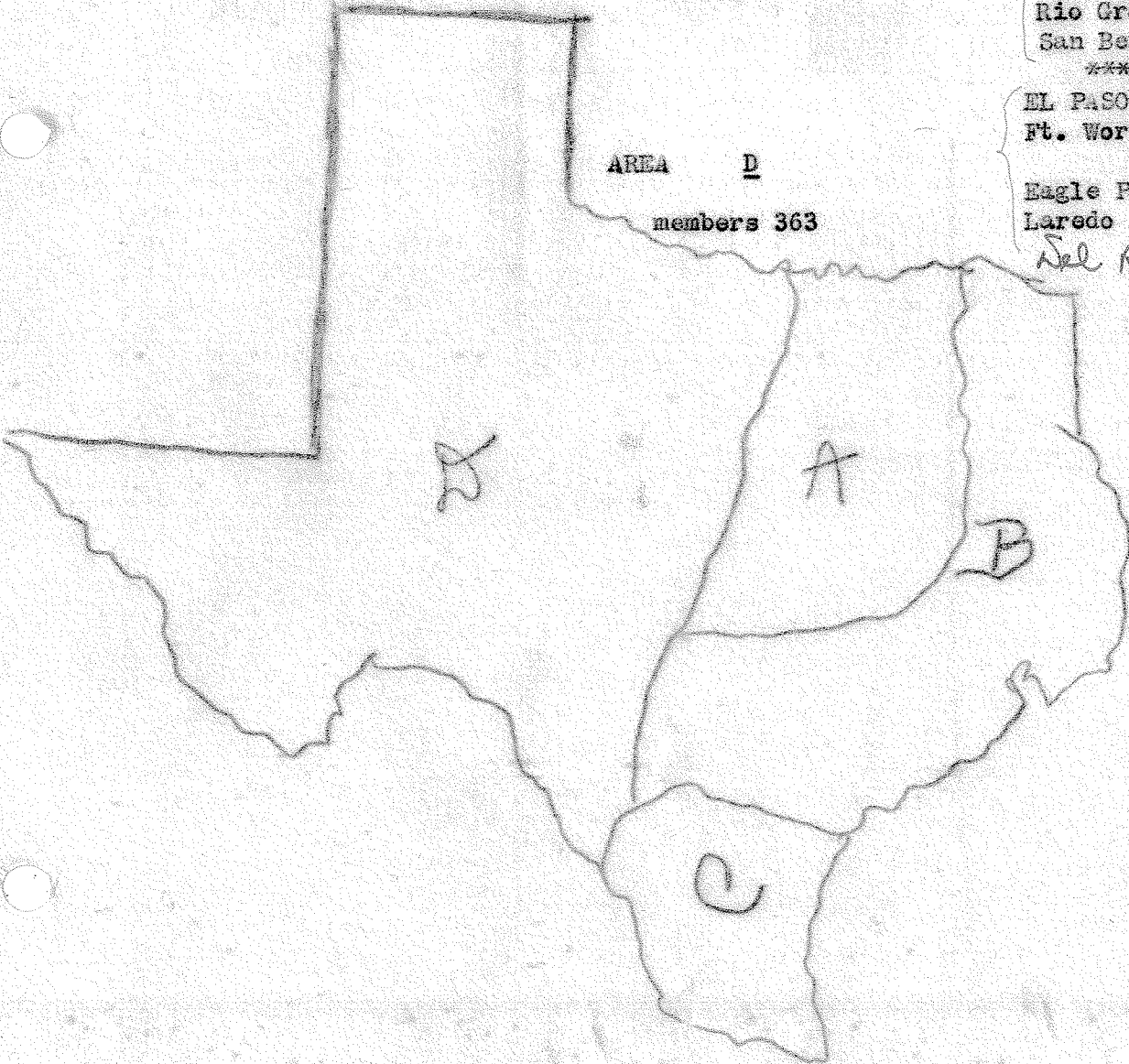

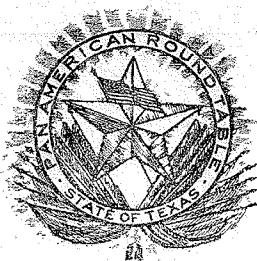

  - A. WHO HAS CONTRIBUTED EXCEPTIONALLY MERITORIOUS SERVICE TO THE PAN AMERICAN ROUND TABLES OF TEXAS, AND IN SO DOING
  - B. UPHELD THE IDEALS OF OUR FOUNDER, FLORENCE TERRY GRISWOLD.
- II. THIS AWARD SHALL BE A HONORARY LIFE MEMBERSHIP IN THE PAN AMERICAN ROUND TABLES OF TEXAS WITH ALL VOTING PRIVILEGES ACCORDED THE RECIPIENT. THE MARK OF THE AWARD SHALL BE A NARROW BAND OF BLUE RIBBON WORN BENEATH THE PAN AMERICAN ROUND TABLE PIN.
- III. ALL FORMER RECIPIENTS SHALL BECOME A COMMITTEE TO CHOOSE A RECIPIENT, WITH THE STATE DIRECTOR APPOINTING A CHAIRMAN FROM THE SAID GROUP OF RECIPIENTS. IT SHALL NOT BE MANDATORY FOR THE COMMITTEE TO MAKE AN AWARD AT EACH STATE CONVENTION, AND FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTIONS MAY NOT BE CONSIDERED SOLELY AS A BASIS FOR THIS AWARD.

## SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE

This Committee is very different from the other committees. Its personnel serves for SIX years, the State Director appointing only one member unless there is a resignation. It is first a committee of Tables as the Chairmanship must rotate among the Tables. In the present membership the Corpus Christi Table has the chairmanship; the next term, McAllen will serve, followed by Dallas I.

Tables having served as Chairman are San Antonio, Dallas II, Beaumont, Austin, and Houston. In case of the resignation or death of the chairman after they have been in office ( as in the case of San Antonio and Corpus Christi ) the State Director appoints someone within that Table to finish out the term of office. But if the resignation comes at first before any work the chairmanship goes to the next in line, and the State Director appoints two to the committee instead of one.

The permanent fund which is at present in the Conroe Federal Savings and Loan was built by gifts of individuals and Tables through the years as a memorial to our founder, Florence Terry Griswold. It reached the \$5000.00 mark during the administration of Mrs. Albert R. Davis. It was hoped that we could build it to a point where its interest each year would carry a scholarship. At the convention in Corpus Christi in 1961 it was voted to use our per capita assessment of 25¢ per member, not as adding to the permanent fund but as money for the scholarship. Today the memorials are the only source for increasing the permanent fund.

The policy on scholarships from the Griswold fund is outlined in the By-Laws of the State Constitution; it says

The Board of 1961 - 1963 instructed the incoming Board to survey the former chairmen of this committee and find out their thoughts on giving the young woman travel as well as college expenses. If this was the case it would limit our scholarships in order to have enough money to do both. From the experiences of the former chairman it was thought that we should give only partial assistance. If at all possible with the student herself sharing some of this expense, at least the incidentals which range from \$ 400 to \$ 600.

The 1964 - 65 recipient has a travel grant and hospital coverage from the State Department; the State pays the college costs; and she pays her incidentals. It is most necessary that there be hospital and accident coverage from the time she leaves her home until she returns.

We got our candidate through the Institute of International Education Inc. They offered us a choice of three girls.

THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE IS ELECTED BY THE STATE BOARD IN EVEN YEARS. THE COMMITTEE CONSISTS OF 5 MEMBERS, EACH AREA BEING REPRESENTED AND ONE MEMBER AT LARGE. THE MEMBER WHO IS FIRST NOMINATED AND ELECTED BECOMES CHAIRMAN.

THE TABLES ARE ASKED TO SEND NAMES OF THE RESPECTIVE NOMINEES TO THE CHAIRMAN. THE COMMITTEE ASKS THAT THE NAMES PRESENTED ARE THOSE WHO WILL GIVE OF THEIR TIME AND TALENTS TO THE WORK OF THE STATE ORGANIZATION.



## RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE SHALL RECEIVE AND <sup>\*</sup>PASS UPON ALL RESOLUTIONS TO BE INTRODUCED : AND PREPARE ALL RESOLUTIONS TO BE PRESENTED BEFORE ANY STATE, NATIONAL, OR FOREIGN ASSEMBLY. THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE SHALL RECEIVE AND SUBMIT TO THE TABLES, ONE MONTH IN ADVANCE OF THE CONVENTION, ALL RESOLUTIONS ( EXCEPT COURTESY ) TO BE PRESENTED TO THE CONVENTION IN SESSION. THE COURTESY RESOLUTIONS WILL BE PRESENTED FROM THE FLOOR UPON THE REQUEST OF THE STATE DIRECTOR. IT IS CUSTOMARY TO SET THE DATE TO RECEIVE THE RESOLUTIONS SO THAT THE COMMITTEE WILL HAVE TIME TO PREPARE FOR PRESENTATION TO THE TABLES.

"Pass upon" - means that the committee sees that it meets the date line, and the form of a resolution is complied with.

The State Director, after presentation at the Convention if the resolution conflicts with State Charter, State Constitution, By-Laws, and Standing Rules. Her ruling can be challenged; and if so, the Parliamentarian has the final say.

## REVISIONS COMMITTEE

THE REVISIONS COMMITTEE SHALL CONSIST OF AT LEAST THREE MEMBERS INCLUDING THE STATE PARLIAMENTARIAN AS CHAIRMAN. THIS COMMITTEE SHALL PREPARE ALL REVISIONS TO THE CONSTITUTION AND BY - LAWS AND RULES OF THE STATE ORGANIZATION.

THESE REVISIONS CAN BE PROPOSED BY EITHER THE STATE BOARD OR THE TABLES. THESE PROPOSALS MUST BE IN THE HANDS OF THE CHAIRMAN BY JANUARY 15th AS THEY ARE SENT TO EACH TABLE ONE MONTH PRIOR TO THE STATE CONVENTION SO THAT EACH TABLE CAN DISCUSS AND INSTRUCT THEIR DELEGATES AS TO WHAT ACTION TO TAKE AT THE CONVENTION WHEN THEY ARE VOTED UPON.

REPORT OF THE FRIENDSHIP COMMITTEE- --- October 24, 1964

Since one of the main purposes of the Pan American Round Table is to further friendship among the women of the Americas, a friendship committee was established to suggest ways that each member or table might show her friendship for our Latin American neighbors. We have wonderful programs on the Latin American Countries which give us knowledge and background on each country, but until we have some personal contact with people from that country, our appreciation of it is very limited. If we are to accomplish anything worthwhile in Pan American Round Table, we must practice friendship not just talk about it and study it.

The Friendship Committee suggests the following things:

1. Members of Pan American Round Tables correspond with ladies of member Tables of the Alliance. Names and addresses of all Directors of the Alliance may be obtained and through them 'penpal' names. Exchanging ideas, ways of living, receipes, good books and magazines, and music with others makes for better understanding.
2. Adopt a Table in another country and write to them about programs and activities of your Table.
3. Contact Nationals of other countries living in your community, and do helpful, kind, things for them. When advisable use these people to give programs for your Table.
4. Send greeting cards to Tables and individuals on special occasions.
5. Invite ladies from the Tables in Mexico to come and stay in your homes for special programs or celebrations. Several of our Tables

are inviting the new Tables of Mexico to be their guests on some special occasion this year. Corsicana is inviting the Victoria Table, Waco- the Puebla Table, Beeville - the Vera Cruz Table, and Conroe- the San Luis Potosi Table. The Mexican Ladies will stay in the homes of the host tables, so that everyone can get better acquainted. This, we feel, is one of the best methods of spreading friendship that we can suggest, and it has been tried with great success among our Valley Tables.

6. We suggest that when available send copies of Robert's Rules of order in Spanish to each member of an adopted Latin American Table. The League of Women Voters prints a pamphlet <sup>for 10¢</sup> called "Procedimiento Parlamentario Abreviado" <sup>Abbreviated Parliamentary Process,</sup> address: 1026 17th St. N.W., Washington 16, D.C. So far our efforts to obtain it have been futile as they continue to send English copies, but if others will try perhaps they will eventually comply with our requests. *(Later, these have been received; so omit.)*

7. Aid and acts of friendship to our foreign students while here in college will never be forgotten. Let us do everything we can to make their stay in the United States a pleasant one.

8. Help nationals from the Latin American countries who come here for medical treatment or bring friends or relatives. This could well be a full time project for any Table where this need exists.

Any act of friendship or kindness shown to a person of a foreign country helps give America a better image as well as gain a friend for ~~us~~ personally. We are told that no one has too many friends, and the trend in our world today is toward suspicion and dislike rather than acceptance and love. Let us as one organization do what we can to push back the tide of hate and hold out hands of friendship in all ways possible to our Latin American neighbors.

That the above resolution be added as Section 6 of Article III of the State Constitution.


