# State Board Awards Scholarships

The Florence Terry Griswold (FTG) Scholarship Committee awarded three scholarships at the Board of Trustees Meeting in Austin, Texas, on March 23, 2007, during the State PART Convention.

Fourteen qualified applications were received for the FTG Scholarship I. This \$4,000 scholarship was awarded to Lilian Lie Nohara from Brazil, a doctoral student at the University of Texas El Paso in biology with a 4.0 GPA. She plans to return to Brazil upon graduation to pursue high quality research on tropical infectious diseases.

Five qualified applications were received for the FTG II scholarship. This \$2,500 scholarship was awarded to Ashley Dyan Ross of Texas A & M University. A doctoral student with a 4.0 GPA, Ashley is studying the comparative politics of Latin America. She will use the scholarship money to live with a host family in Costa Rica to study language and culture.

The scholarship committee also awarded the Melba Dawson Scholarship of \$3,500 to Lisa Benjamin. Lisa is from Trinidad & Tobago and a doctoral student at Texas A & M University studying epidemiology with a 3.5 GPA. Lisa intends to return to the Caribbean/Latin America region to work in her field.


