DIAMOND JUBILEE



The 75th Anniversary of the founding of the first Pan American Round Table was celebrated on Friday, October 18, 1991 in San Antonio, Texas. The San Antonio observance will remain as one of the most successful gatherings that our institution has ever had. Congratulations to the San Antonio Table, its Director, Mrs. Dolly Glasscock and Brig. Gen. Claire Garrecht, Chairman of the event. For those who attended, it was an uplifting experience, a reaffirmation of what Florence Terry Griswold set out to do and the opportunity to rededicate ourselves to keeping those ideals alive into the 21st century and beyond.

The final attendance figures were 292 participants, from four different countries and three states. Ten of the eleven members elected to the Texas State Board attended, along with the Corresponding Secretary and six presidents of Standing Committees. Nineteen Texas Tables were represented, as well as three New Mexico Tables, two California Tables, thirteen Tables from Mexico, one Table from the Dominican Republic and three Tables from Peru. Numerous Alliance officers were present, headed by the Alliance Director General, Mrs. Mila de Coquis, from Lima, Peru. Our collective thanks to the Menger Hotel, for their good service. Words simply cannot reflect the lasting effect that the Diamond Jubilee has had on those who attended, but the future will reflect the hope and dynamism recreated at that wonderful occasion. Also in attendance were three Past State Directors, Mrs. Cleo Seelinger, Mrs. Frances Metcalf and Mrs. Gloria Zuniga as well as a Past Director General, Mrs. Helena Richards, from San Jose, California.

IN MEMORIUM

Sadly, we write of the passing of Grace Harris
Lake, named by the International Alliance of Pan
American Round Tables as Pan American Woman of the Year for
1988-1990. Those who knew Grace remember her as an active
civic leader in El Paso, Texas, and Juarez, Mexico. She truly

embodied the goals and ideals of the Pan American movement. A member of the El Paso Table she had been an enthusiastic liason between the United States Tables and those in Mexico, Central and South America, frequently travelling to those As a locales. member of the Comite de Damas Pro Comercio (Juarez equivalent of the Woman's Dept. of the El

Paso Chamber of Commerce) she served on the Committee for the Juvenile Rehabilitation Center, DIF projects, and the Family Planning Project.

Due to her influence in the community, many children recieved a better education, families received medical attention and/or financial aid when they otherwise might have received none. Her advice was sought in all phases of living. Some of her many hobbies included cooking and hot air ballooning. She enjoyed the respect of all who knew her. A favorite quote of hers: "IT'S NOT YOUR AGE, IT'S YOUR ENTHUSIASM!"

Last November, the Pan American Movement lost a dear friend with the death of Mrs. C.E. Mangham, daughter of PART founder Florence Terry Griswold. Mrs. Mangham was 92 years old at the time of her passing. We were fortunate to have had her at our Diamond Jubilee Celebration in San Antonio.

In May of 1991, we were saddened to learn of the death of Eduardo Coquis, husband of Alliance Director General, Mila Coquis, of Lima, Peru. When Mila was in Texas last October, she was given a list of Tables and individuals who had given to the Memorial Fund. Her desire is that this be given for travel expenses to a person doing research or studying in Peru. She graciously offered her home in Lima as their residence while in Peru. In the true spirit of friendship, she says this would permit her to offer hospitality to someone who needs a place to stay and also enable her to become acquainted with the person and her interests.

The University of Texas and the Austin Table will recommend a student to receive this honor. At this time, there is \$425 in the travel expense fund.

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION



Maria Iracema S. Mastroleo, from Sao Paulo, Brazil, is the winner of the Florence Terry Griswold Scholarship I for the 1992-93 academic year. Ms. Mastroleo has a Bachelor's degree in Speech Language Therapy from Escola Paulista de Medicina in Sao Paulo. She became enthusiastic about her career in speech therapy when she saw the difference



she could make with her clients in Brazil. She is now a student of Rehabilitation Counseling Education at UT in Austin. Maria is convinced that the knowledge she gains in Austin will eventually impact innumerable lives, for she plans not only to practice as a therapist, but also to train others so that her efforts will be multiplied.

Our 1992 Scholarship II receipient is Caroline Pomeroy, a PhD candidate in

Wildlife Fisheries Studies at Texas A & M University in Bryan, Texas. Ms. Pomeroy is majoring in Wildlife and Fisheries Sciences, with a minor in Sociology. Her plans are to pursue research on the fishers of Lake Chapala in the state of Jalisco, Mexico as a part of her long-standing interest in the social organization of small-scale commercial fishers and their efforts to adapt to change in social, political, and physical environments.

On October 21, 1991 Pomeroy began two months of preliminary fieldwork at Lake Chapala. Her dissertation proposal was approved in early February 1992. The Florence Terry Griswold Scholarship II will help support this dissertation research.

Many of you know of the dissolution of Dallas Table I this past year. What you may not know is that when the Table disbanded they had \$1,000 in their account which they have generously donated to the Pan American Round Tables Scholarship Endowment Fund. Their gift will guarantee that the work of Dallas Table I is perpetuated forever. Many thanks go to our sisters in Dallas as they merge with Dallas Table III to become the new Dallas Table.
